

Village residents must have their refuse placed curbside by no later than 7:00am on May 15, as Waste Management will begin pickup and will only make one pickup at each residence. Please break down refuse to allow for ease of handling. Refuse placed in the right-of-way after May 15<sup>th</sup> may be subject to a Civil Infraction Ticket.

## Village Code Enforcement & Montcalm Sheriff Department Enforcing Blight Ordinance

Village code enforcement will be working with the Montcalm Sheriff Department this spring to ensure the blight ordinance is enforced. Properties that are in violation of the ordinance will be provided notice in the coming weeks. The "Blight Ordinance" is to; Prevent areas of the Village that are, or may become, blighted with the resulting impairment of taxable values upon which operating revenues to the Village of Edmore.

Door hangers will inform residents of a suspected violation, followed up by a letter and if necessary the issue of a citation.

Examples of blight include: Tall grass (one foot), yard waste, debris, inoperable motor vehicles and building materials. For the full ordinance visited

## **UPDATED FENCE & NEW CHICKEN ORDINANCE**

Are you planning to install a new fence on your property? Does that old fence need to be repaired?

Check the Edmore Village website for the requirements of new and old fences. Setbacks have changed for fences not to be placed on your property that would obstruct the view for vehicular traffic. It also address the types and heights of fences. Permits are required for new fences. They can be picked up and dropped off at the Village Office.

#### Looking to have fresh eggs?

The Village of Edmore adopted a Chicken Ordinance last year to allow chickens within the Village. However, there is a one time \$5.00 permit. To learn more about the chicken ordinance and what is required to have those fresh eggs check the Edmore Village website.



#### Hydrant Flushing to Begin in Late May-Early June

The Edmore DPW will begin to flush hydrants in late May and early June as weather and staffing allows. Hydrants will be flushed during late night and early morning hours to limit the loss of water pressure. If your tap has rusty or off color water please run for several minutes and it should eventually run clear. If it does not please feel free to call the Village DPW at 427-3747.



## We Want To See Your Numbers

The Edmore DPW, Local Emergency Services and the Montcalm County Building Department would like to remind residents of the Village to make sure your house and or business has approved numbers or addresses in such a position as to be plainly visible and legible from the street or road fronting the property. The Montcalm County Building Department will not perform inspections on unidentified sites, DPW may not be able to locate a shut off valve in a water emergency and it could cost valuable minutes during an emergency. Properly displaying your address could save your life! Please make sure:



- -Building numbers are at least 4 inches tall
- -That trees or shrubs are trimmed so numbers are visible
- -House numbers are lit, reflective or contrasting

## Brush Clean-Up and Chipping Reminder

Yard Waste is collected for free each Tuesday of the month and brush collection/chipper service is provided the first Tuesday of the month to all single family residential properties April through November. Yard waste must be in yard waste bags that are available at the Village Offices for only ¢50.

Brush shall be placed in the front yard at the edge of the public street with ends sticking out.

No limbs larger than 4 inches in diameter will be accepted.

Piles of brush should be stacked neatly and orderly and under four feet in height.

No vines or loose leaves will be accepted, lawn bags are available for purchase at the village office.

Brush intertwined with plastics will not be accepted.

No metal or wire (fencing, electrical cable, root balls, etc) will be accepted.

No lot clearing debris or whole tree or that from a byproduct of commercial cutting/ trimming will be accepted.

Limit the weight of bags to less than 50 lbs.

Place by the curb by 7:30am.

## **Cemetery Reminders**

- Potted Plants are allowed April 1st- November 1st.
- Seasonal Decorations not removed by those dates can be removed without notice.
- All flowers, containers are to be set on a concrete base. No glass.
- No tree of any type shall be planted (without the approval from the DPW Supervisor).
- The DPW may remove or trim any plant, tree or shrub in the the interest of maintaining the use and appearance of the Cemetery.

#### No Wipes Down the Pipes

Village Reminds Residents to Protect Sewer Systems

**Edmore, MI** – The Village of Edmore would like to remind residents that only three items should be flushed down the drain; #1, #2 and toilet paper. All other material is not made to flush smoothly through the sewer system. Please help keep the Village sewer system flowing smoothly by not flushing anything else down the toilet.

Unfortunately, some items marketed as "flushable" have become a threat to residential and municipal sewer systems, causing expensive clogs and messy sewage back up in homes and businesses.

"Clogged pumps have a tough time pumping waste to the sanitary sewer system when they are clogged with 'flushable' wipes," said Andy Andersen, Edmore DPW Supervisor. "Flushable' wipes are not made to be flushed and can cause costly sewage backups into people's basements."

If you must use a "wet wipe" instead of toilet paper, please dispose of them in the garbage. Remember, the only thing you should ever flush down a toilet is #1, #2 and toilet paper. And keep in mind: "No Wipes Down the Pipes"

#### Some items not to flush:

- Baby wipes, disinfectant wipes, moist wipes, etc.
- Diapers (cloth, disposable, "flushable")
- Sanitary napkins, tampons, condoms, or any non- organic material
- Fats, oils, and grease (FOG)
- Dental floss, Q-tips and cotton balls
- "Swiffers" toilet bowl scrub pads
- Napkins (paper or cloth), paper towels, facial tissues
- Seeds, peelings, egg shells, nutshells, and coffee grounds
- Bandages and bandage wrappings
- Clothing, Wash cloths, towels, rags (any cloth item)
- Plastic of any kind
- Medicines/pharmaceuticals (put original containers in a plastic zip-lock bag, throw the bag in the trash or take to a recycling, drop-off, or household hazardous waste collection)
- Harmful chemicals such as solvent-based glue, paint, strippers, wood preservatives, nail
  polish, antifreeze, engine cleaners/degreasers, gasoline, motor oil, fertilizers, pesticides, and
  pool/spa chemicals
